



Tax Filing Date Extended

Earlier today, March 20, Treasury Secretary Mnuchin announced the IRS is extending the April 15 tax-filing deadline to July 15, coinciding with the [\(earlier announced\)](#) 90 day extension to pay certain federal income taxes otherwise due on April 15.

We are already seeing that there are many other issues critical to our client's future to address outside of filing tax returns. As a result, Frost, PLLC will proceed as planned to file our clients' tax returns as soon as possible and continue advising you on the benefits of the extension to pay at the federal level.
